The Color Run to bring a rainbow mess to London

People throwing things at you when you're running down the street is never going to be good, right?

Well, sometimes it can be.

The Color Run is coming to London for the first time to celebrate health, happiness, individuality and getting messy.

The popular event – which, to explain its spelling, began in the United States – is to be held at the Western Fair District on Aug. 17.

It sees runners of all ages, sizes and abilities start in all-white clothing and ends with them looking like human rainbows, after different shades of coloured powder are thrown at runners along the route.

It's all in aid of local charities, and London's beneficiaries will be the Tara "Boom" Houston Children's Foundation, which gives financial help to the families of sick kids.

"The Color Run is all about having fun and healthy living, while giving back to local charities," said founder Travis Snyder. "The event brings the community together and creates energy so positive it's contagious. Our mantra is 'Be Happy. Be Healthy. Be You'."

- More than 60 per cent of "Color Runners" are first-time 5K* runners and participate as a celebration of their healthy living accomplishments.






